your great interest in the matter, suggest to you to look into "Preliminary Recommendations on Post-war problems" formulated by the "Interamerican Committee appointed by the 3rd Meeting of the Ministers on Foreign Affairs of the American Republics" published in "Internat. Conciliation", Carnegie Endowment for Int. Peace No. 389. You would find it in the Cambridge Law Library! Though one can hardly agree with all points the American point of view is certainly of great interest!

May I take the opportunity to inform you of an "incident", which caused me to write to Dr. Mueller-Sturmheim as per enclosed letter.
